### #GIVINGTUESDAY: MOTHER OF MERCY HOUSE

Walking down East Allegheny Avenue, you might hear gunshots nearby, or notice needles littered across the sidewalk. You’ll find men and women lying unconscious on the curbs, and be met by many starving individuals.

But in the midst of the horrors that surround you, you’ll also find Mother of Mercy House.

Led by Fr. Liam Murphy and Sr. Ann Raymond Welte, Mother of Mercy House is a ministry of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia seeking to share the mercy of God’s love with all. Among the violence and destruction that awaits the residents of Kensington every day, Mother of Mercy House is a place of hope, of acceptance, of peace.

Mother of Mercy House offers the people of Kensington a variety of much-needed supportive services, including daily Mass, food pantry access, annual coat and school supply distributions and free clinical evaluations. But their most powerful service does not come in physical form. Instead, it’s spiritual.

It’s no secret that Philadelphia is in the midst of a drug crisis and that Kensington is the epicenter. It has become routine for Fr. Murphy and Sr. Ann, along with staff from other local businesses, to witness drug-related incidences. But the staff


here goes a step further, providing something that many addicts cannot always find but need so desperately: support.

Fr. Murphy and Sr. Ann offer spiritual guidance to anyone who comes to them with addiction troubles. They walk the streets tending to individuals battling addiction, sometimes driving them to detox facilities to get clean. They also provide comfort to struggling families coping with their loved ones’ addictions. In the most heartbreaking cases, they counsel grieving families and friends.

Today, Mother of Mercy House is still actively working to put an end to this tragic drug epidemic impacting our city. That’s why for 2017, CFGP selected Mother of Mercy House as its official partner and beneficiary of #GivingTuesday. Every year, held after the popular shopping days Black Friday and Cyber Monday, #GivingTuesday kicks off the charitable season by joining individuals, communities, and organizations around the world together for one common purpose: giving back.

CFGP’s 2017 #GivingTuesday initiative for Mother of Mercy House raised more than \$10,000 for their vital ministry in Kensington.

## GRANTS

At the heart of our foundation is charity, and at the heart of charity is love. Grants from CFGP are the basis of why we’re here – to support others in our community who are doing the work of Christ. CFGP is grateful to have supported the work of these organizations in the last fiscal year.

### IHM Center for Literacy

The IHM Center for Literacy is an educational ministry of the Sisters of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The Literacy Center, which currently has two locations in Philadelphia, facilitates the incorporation of immigrants into American society through the teaching of English language skills, computer skills and job skills. Since the first site opened 25 years ago, the IHM Center for Literacy has helped thousands of immigrants from several different countries assimilate to American culture, obtain employment and housing, and provide for their families.

CFGP awarded the IHM Center for Literacy a \$5,000 grant to purchase whiteboards for their Farragut Street site. These whiteboards replaced aging blackboards that the Center had been using for years. The boards had become illegible and difficult to write on. With the new whiteboards in place, the instructors at the Center can teach their ESL and citizenship classes effectively and efficiently.

### Catholic Social Services - Montgomery County Family Service Center

Catholic Social Services, a subsidiary of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, has service centers stationed throughout the 5-county Philadelphia area. These centers provide assistance to individuals and families struggling with poverty, food insecurity, homelessness, job attainment and more. Each center offers a number of emergency services including clothing cupboards and food pantries, rent or utility bill assistance, housing referrals, and case management. There is also employment training, ESL classes, GED preparation, and job placement assistance available.

CFGP awarded \$2,000 to the Montgomery County Family Service Center in support of a newly-established nutrition education program. The program, called Martha’s Choice “Shop n’ Chop,” was conducted through the Center’s on-site food pantry, Martha’s Choice Marketplace.

The “Shop n’ Chop” program focused on nutrition education in an emergency food environment using a “Train the Trainer” technique with peer mentors. Because these mentors will be fellow community members, they face similar challenges as those benefiting from the program. Evidence shows that community health employees who offer peer support can help individuals meet basic health needs, especially those difficult to engage, such as low income, minority or other socioeconomically disadvantaged individuals.

The Montgomery County Family Service Center also partnered with Villanova University’s Center for Obesity Prevention Education (COPE) to bring this program to life. Together, the Center and COPE provided an educational foundation for selecting and preparing healthy meals.

### Deaf Apostolate, Archdiocese of Philadelphia

The Deaf Apostolate of the Archdiocese provides pastoral care, religious education, and regular Masses in American Sign Language for the benefit of the deaf and hard of hearing within the Catholic community. CFGP awarded a \$5,000 grant to the Deaf Apostolate for their 2018 summer camp, Camp Overbrook: IN SIGN.

Held at St. Joseph’s University in June 2018, Camp Overbrook was a month-long summer day camp for deaf and hard of hearing children ages 6 – 15. Camp Overbrook: IN SIGN was first held in 1994. The camp was designed to provide a sense of community for children, dispelling feelings of isolation that deafness can cause. Today, Camp Overbrook continues to live out its mission within a safe, fun environment for education and religious formation.



**Our Mother of Sorrows/  
St. Ignatius of Loyola School**

Our Mother of Sorrows/St. Ignatius of Loyola School is a pre-K – 8th Grade Catholic school founded in 2005 after the merging of Our Mother of Sorrows School and St. Ignatius of Loyola School. Now under one united mission, Our Mother of Sorrows/St. Ignatius is part of the Independence Mission Schools and works to provide a faith-based, quality education in a healthy, respectful, caring environment.

Our Mother of Sorrows/St. Ignatius of Loyola School was awarded an \$8,000 grant for the purchase of laptops to replace their desktop computers in the Student Computer Lab. The Computer Lab can now be transformed into an additional classroom for the School's increasing number of students without jeopardizing their access to technology.



**Mothers' Home**

A residential shelter located in Darby, Pennsylvania, Mothers' Home is a safe haven for vulnerable, pregnant women in crisis who see life as a sacred, cherished gift. Mothers' Home encourages all residents to celebrate the joy of new life as they help them to prepare for their future and the future of their child.

Mothers' Home puts special focus on the physical, emotional and developmental needs of the moms' in their care. This means giving them access to parenting training and job preparation, with the ultimate goal of independence and self-sufficiency.

Mothers' Home received a \$4,800 grant award to purchase new beds and bedding supplies for their residential shelter.



**Mother Teresa Regional Catholic School**

Mother Teresa Catholic School (MTC) calls King of Prussia its home, educating pre-K through 8th grade students with a Christ-centered approach. Faith is integrated into all areas of education at MTC through participation at Mass, liturgical events, sacramental preparation, daily prayer and service projects. MTC is also accredited through the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools.

CFGP awarded a \$5,000 grant to MTC for the expansion of their STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) program. Through our grant, MTC began their expansion project by purchasing the Houghton Mifflin Harcourt Science Dimensions curriculum, a discovery-based science program. This program provides all the components of a meaningful science and engineering program, yielding innovation and long-term cognitive skills. In addition, MTC is developing a full science lab with the help of additional funders.





### CFGP'S WOMEN IN PHILANTHROPY FORUM

October 18, 2017 | The Inn at Villanova University

CFGP's annual Women in Philanthropy Forum began in 2016 with the intention of bringing together influential women leaders and philanthropists to host an immersive discussion with their peers. For our 2017 program, we brought in expert panelists who revealed the future of philanthropy in the hands of Millennials, and how to inspire new generations to engage in charity.

The forum also featured a Q&A period and networking segment.

### FALL PHILANTHROPIC WORKSHOP SERIES – DONOR CENTRICITY

CFGP's fall 2017 Philanthropic Workshop Series focused on donor centricity and mission-driven fundraising and development strategies. CFGP's Emily Gambino, Associate Director, Mission Advancement Services, and Joanne Beck, Marketing Manager, returned as guest speakers.

Our first topic at our fall workshop discussed making the most of your organization's data and maximizing your direct mail and solicitation pieces. Ms. Gambino also focused on the importance of keeping a clean and updated donor database, personalization of solicitations, and unique, efficient ways of thanking your donors.

Following her discussion, Mrs. Beck led a presentation on how to master your organization's email marketing strategy, recommending all email campaigns be segmented, personalized, and organized. She also discussed techniques for magnifying an organization's social media presence. Mrs. Beck concluded her discussion by recommending user-friendly digital marketing software and discussing the importance of choosing the proper social media outlets for your organization's audience.

CFGP's spring 2018 Philanthropic Workshop Series helped attendees navigate the in's and out's of the new tax law. 



## 2018 REVENUE





■ Contributions - 51%
